Thank you, and the Lord fill you with joy in knowing you have made it possible for someone to touch the promises of Jesus.

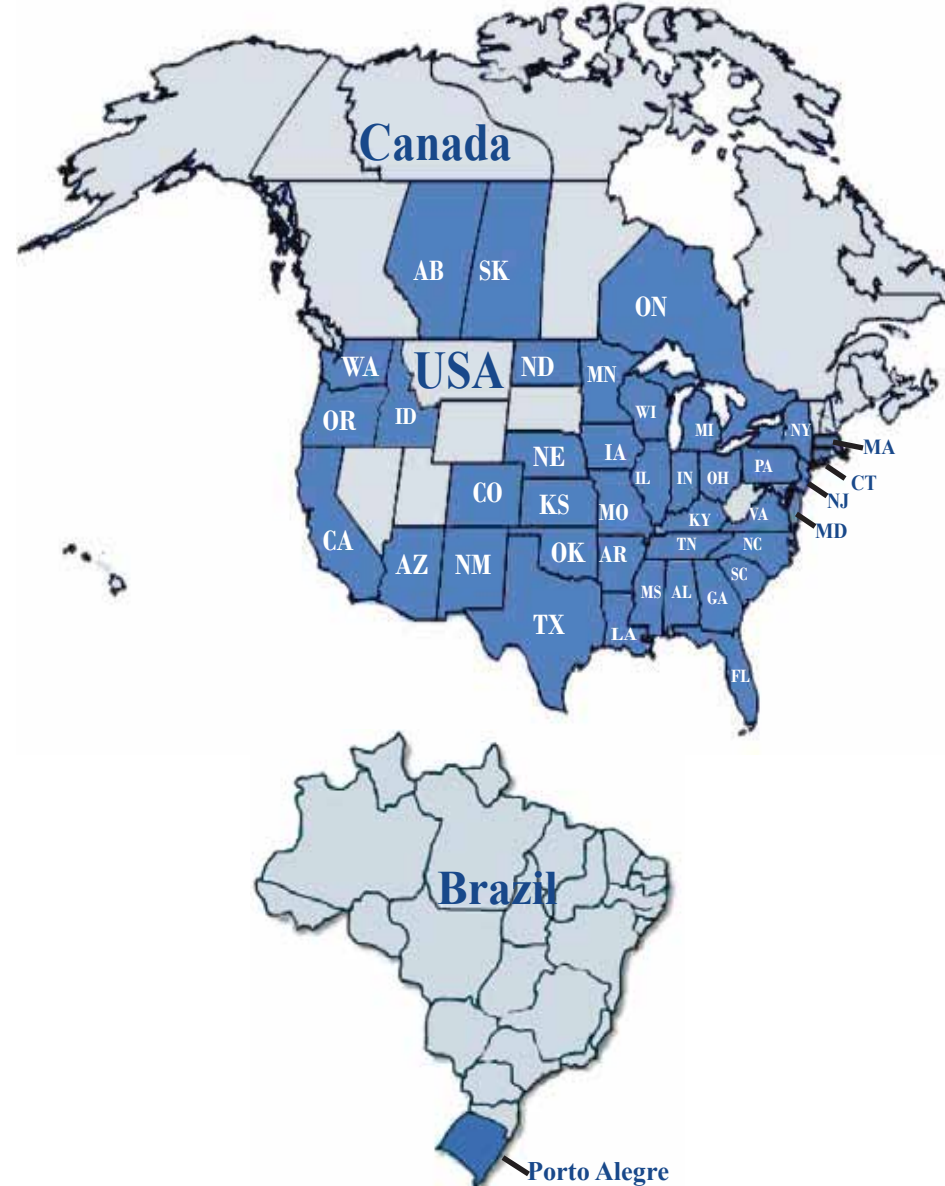

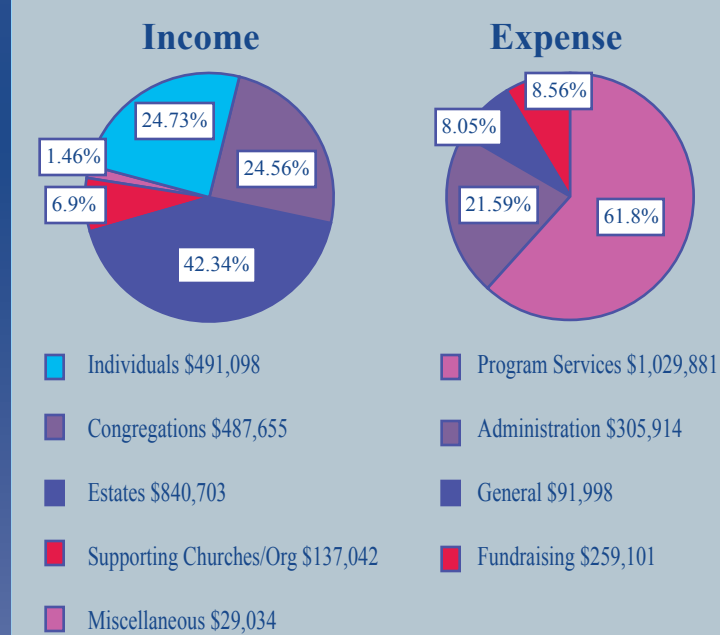
Mission Statement

Its intent is to provide a brief overview of the financial status and work that has been accomplished in 2009. Of utmost importance is that we, at LBW, are humbled, amazed and inspired while all the time

thankful to our God for His goodness to us through you and those who are now in glory. God is Good...All the Time!

What the chart and graphs may not show is:

- That with the economic challenges of 2009, LBW kept its expenses in line and balanced its budget
- With increased estate income, LBW was able to begin establishing financial reserves
- The Bible Book Club membership (donors who have committed to regularly support LBW) remained constant in 2009. Interested parties may contact the home office for further information
- A net three new Work Centers were opened in 2009
- The number of volunteers stayed relatively constant between 5,000 and 5,100
- LBW and Valparaiso University entered into a collaborative venture to produce a new generation of embossing presses for Braille
- LBW received specially targeted project grants from the Dunklau Foundation, Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML), Thrivent Foundation and the Werner Foundation
- LBW has no long term debt or financial obligation
- The estimated aggregate value of our volunteers' donated hours if paid minimum wage would amount to \$6.4 million in 2009

Entering a new year, LBW counts its blessings from a Loving God including a faithful group of prayer warriors, volunteers and financial supporters. Motivated to helping people touch the promises of Jesus, LBW strives, with God's help, to grow its ministry in 2010.
